*Did you know that?...*

*Clemens Herschel* was an American hydraulic engineer. He is best known for inventing the Venturi meter, which was the first large-scale, accurate device for measuring water flow.

*Hal Blaine* was an American drummer and session musician, thought to be among the most recorded studio drummers in the music industry, claiming over 35,000 sessions and 6,000 singles. His drumming is featured on 150 US top 10 hits, 40 of which went to number one.

*James B. Emerson* established the Holyoke Testing Flume on the Canal System later described by "father of modern hydrology", Robert E. Horton, as the "first modern hydraulic laboratory" in the United States and the world.

1. Your entry must be original and unaided.
2. The art must be connected to, or inspired by, Holyoke's significant achievements and inventions.
3. Accepted discipline of artwork includes:

4. A total of two pieces of artwork may be entered per artist but a maximum of one award will be awarded per artist.
5. **THE CLOSING DATE FOR THE SUBMISSIONS IS SEPTEMBER 26, 2024. ALL ART MUST BE DELIVERED TO HOLYOKE HERITAGE PARK BY THIS DATE.**

6. Paintings, drawings, photography, and other flat artwork must be ready to hang with a wire attached approximately 1/3 from the top, whether framed or not. Framing is optional.
7. All submissions must be delivered to the Holyoke Heritage State Park, 221 Appleton Street, Holyoke.

8. Artwork must include the completed entry form and a very brief written narrative about how the work relates to Holyoke's history and/or vision for the city's future.
9. Awards are given at judges' discretion and are based on originality and technique/execution. If your entry reaches the final judging stage and is being considered for an award, you may be asked for verification of the grade level.
10. All winners will be asked to be photographed with his/her artwork which will be posted on the Holyoke Preservation Trust website.
11. The Holyoke Preservation Trust cannot be held responsible for plagiarism in artwork.
12. Works of art must be exhibited for the entire event. No early removal of artwork is allowed under any circumstances.
13. Winners will be announced, and awards distributed in mid-September. Winners need not be present to win but everyone is encouraged to attend. Details will be provided at a later date. **Items not picked up by November 9, 2024, will become the property of the Holyoke Preservation Trust.**
14. Holyoke Preservation Trust and Holyoke Heritage Park will use best efforts to take utmost care of artwork but cannot be held liable for damaged or missing artwork.

15. The rules of the competition may not be changed or modified and will be strictly applied.
16. ***For students under the age of 18:*** Parent, legal guardian, or teacher: by signing the entry form, you accept the rules listed in this application, as well as additional rules of the event. You agree to hold harmless and indemnify the Holyoke Preservation Trust and Holyoke Heritage Park and their agents and employees for damage from any cause.
