Frederick Law Olmsted (April 26, 1822 – August 28, 1903) was an American landscape architect, journalist, social critic, and public administrator whose architecture firm designed many of the 19th century's most beautiful and recognizable parks, plazas and buildings, including NYC's Central Park. The Olmsteds designed and landscaped several homes and parks in Holyoke including Pulaski Park.

**Official Rules:**

1. Must be in grades 6-12 as of May 15, 2022 and live in Holyoke or attend a Holyoke school to enter.
2. Your entry must be certified as original and unaided.
3. The art must be connected to, or inspired by, Olmsted's landscape designs for the parks or the homes in Holyoke.
4. Accepted discipline of artwork includes:

Painting	Clay
Glass	Printmaking
Drawing	Metal
Mixed-Media	Wood
Fiber	Digital
Jewelry	Photography
Sculpture	Other
5. Up to two pieces of artwork may be entered per student but a maximum of one award will be awarded per student.
6. THE CLOSING DATE FOR THE COMPETITION IS MAY 15, 2022. ALL ART MUST BE DELIVERED OR POSTMARKED BY THIS DATE.
7. Paintings, drawings, photography, and other flat artwork must be ready to hang with a wire attached approximately 1/3 from the top, whether framed or not. Framing is optional.
8. Performances must be between 1-3 minutes and be delivered either via an mp4

- file emailed to HPT or by CD or USB stick. Date(s) for live performances will be arranged and publicized.
9. All artwork and performance files are to be delivered to the event site: Holyoke Preservation Trust @ Gateway City Arts, 92 Race Street, Holyoke. Please check the GCA website for dates / hours of operation.
  10. Artwork / performance files must include:
    - Name
    - Phone Number
    - Title of Entry
    - Written Narrative about how the work relates to Olmsted / Holyoke (for performances)
  11. Awards are given at judges' discretion and are based on originality and technique/execution. If your entry reaches the final judging stage and is being considered for an award, you may be asked to verify your age.
  12. All winners will be photographed with his/her artwork which will be posted on the Holyoke Preservation Trust website.
  13. The Holyoke Preservation Trust cannot be held responsible for plagiarism in student artwork.
  14. Works of art must be exhibited for the entire event, until 3pm on Sunday, June 5. No early removal of artwork is allowed under any circumstances.

15. Winners will be announced, and awards distributed on Sunday, June 5, at 1pm. Winners need not be present to win but everyone is encouraged to attend. Artwork may be picked up on Sunday any time after 3pm until 5pm, when the event closes. Artwork not picked up becomes the property of the Holyoke Preservation Trust.
16. Holyoke Preservation Trust will use best efforts to take utmost care of artwork but cannot be held liable for damaged or missing artwork.
17. The rules of the competition may not be changed or modified and will be strictly applied.
18. Parent, legal guardian, or art teacher: by signing this agreement, you accept the rules listed in this application, as well as additional rules of the event. You agree to hold harmless and indemnify the Holyoke Preservation Trust and their agents and employees for damage from any cause.
